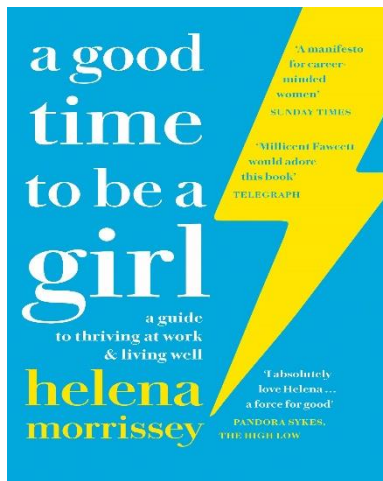


Dame Helena Morrissey



Founder of the 30% club, a global movement that campaigns for gender balance on corporate boards, Dame Morrissey was named the 2017 Financial Times business leader of the year.

She is the Head of Personal Investing at Legal & General Investment Management, which has £894 billion of assets under management. Her recent book, *A Good Time to be a Girl: Don't Lean in, Change the System*, brought her to Toronto to speak about her personal journey and provide inspiration for women to pave their own paths to success.

Women lead differently. Dame Helena spoke from her own experience, particularly about her role as CEO of her firm, where she made the conscious decision to lead like a woman, not like a man. Women have empathy. We like to be liked. We need to earn trust. We cannot earn the right to lead by just having a title. What we bring to the table as women, the qualities and insights which are desperately needed in all aspects of business and life, only emerge when we fearlessly bring our whole selves. We are not pseudo-men.
